<b>Course Description</b>	<p>The course will focus on the rules governing the law applicable to relations across different legal jurisdictions between natural persons, companies, and other legal entities. The current private international law legal framework through the analysis of the relevant domestic legislation (the Italian Law No 218 of 1995), the most important EU regulations and the uniform rules set out in international treaties will be analysed.</p>
<b>Course Objectives and Expected Learning Outcomes</b>	<p>The course aims at providing students with a basic understanding of international private and procedural law in order to be able to deal with the most frequent and urgent issues in private transnational relationship in an appropriate fashion.</p>
