Course Description	The course is directed to deepen and complete the legal knowledge in the field of navigation and transport law through the critical analysis of the private and public profiles of International, European, and national law as well as the most significant case law.				
Course Objectives and Expected Learning Outcomes	The purpose is to enable the student to apply the institutes of aviation law, to facilitate a personal competency of cognitive tools that will allow him/her to solve practical cases as well as develop a critical ability and an autonomous evaluation.				
Program (contents, modalities) The possible distinction between attending and non-attending program	The course will cover the following topics: - Air navigation authorities and International bodies - Sovereignty and freedom in the air space - air services- The Chicago Convention - Access to the European air transport market - Agreements between airlines - Aircraft operating contracts - Airports - The contract of carriage by air of passengers and cargo and air carrier liability - The legal regime of airspace and outer space -Liability for damage caused by space activities				

- For attending students, specific exam programs can be agreed upon, based on the topics covered in class. - For out-of-class students and working students the program is reduced. Methods of Assessment	The examination is oral and comprises three questions. Students who have attended at least 50% of the course can take the examination based on a syllabus agreed upon with the teacher. At the student's choice, in this case, it is possible to submit a written paper that deepens one of the topics covered in class. The evaluation of the exam will be carried out taking into consideration: - the ability to develop critical arguments. - the ability to make connections between the different parts of the program. - the ability to analyze jurisprudential and doctrinal orientations.
