Course Info	<p>The course has an annual duration and is divided in 2 semesters for a total of 14 credits. The final exam will be held orally. The students who attend the course (at least 75% of the classes) will be offered the option to take an intermediate test at the end of the first semester, with exemption from the final exam (only in case of a positive outcome of the intermediate test) of the parts of the program included in the first module (i.e. the general rules, first degree ordinary proceeding, simplified proceeding, as well as the mediation and negotiation, evidence).</p> <p>Students who attend the course during the second semester will benefit from a program reduction on the topics that will be indicated in class.</p>

Course Description	<p>The course focuses on the study of the fundamental and constitutional principles of the Italian Civil Procedure, also from an international perspective, as well as the foundations, in details, of the Civil Procedural</p>
Course goals and expected learning results	<p>The course aims at making students familiar with the Italian Civil Procedure and to give them an adequate knowledge of the foundations, remedies and techniques of the proceedings. The expected results of the learning are obviously in line with the aim of the course.</p>
Program (attending and not attending students)	<p>Moving on from the constitutional principles, the program illustrates the various forms of jurisdictional remedies and the foundations disciplined in the four books of the Civil Procedure Code, as in particular:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) general rules2) mediation and negotiation3) the ordinary proceeding in first degree,4) the simplified proceeding
