Course description	The course aims to analyze territorial dynamics with attention to territorial and environmental policies, and to social action. With attention to the interaction between "environment, individuals and society", we will deal with mobility, inequalities, environmental problems and local and global dynamics
Course objectives and expected learning outcomes	<p>Knowledge and understanding: Understanding territorial dynamics, problems relating to the environmental issue and the concepts necessary for the analysis of territorial phenomena.</p> <p>Applied Knowledge and understanding: knowledge of categories useful for the analysis of territorial issues (mobility, migration, inequalities); concepts necessary to understand the complexity of the environment / individuals relationships (space, distance, boundary, limit); tools to understand the relationship between policies and environmental issues.</p> <p>Autonomy of judgement: To read "critically" the relationship between policies, territory and the environmental issue in late modern society and compare it with what has happened over time.</p> <p>Communication skills: learning sociological language and social theory for the analysis and interpretation of territorial phenomena.</p> <p>Learning skills: learning the most current territorial issues with the tools of territorial sociology and the ability to observe the macro dynamics of the ecology-world in the relationship between nature, environment and mode of production.</p>
