Frequency Mode

The methods are indicated in article 8 of the University teaching regulations.

Method of Assessment

The course includes, for those attending students, intermediate evaluation tests, with an exempt value.

Exam candidates will be subjected to a written test (multiple choice questions or written comprehension, business letter) and an oral one. The written test is preparatory to the oral one. If the evaluation of the written test is lower than the notation corresponding to 18/30, the student remains "not recommended" to appear to take the oral exam. However, exceptionally and after precise and motivated agreements with the teacher, the student who has obtained a notation in the written tes corresponding to 16 or 17/30, will still be able to take the interview. The final grade will be the result of the appropriately weighted grades obtained in the written and oral tests.
