Course objectives and expeted learning outcomes	Knowledge and understanding: Understanding territorial dynamics, problems relating to the environmental issue and the concepts necessary for the analysis of territorial phenomena.  Applied Knowledge and understanding: knowledge of categories useful for the analysis of territorial issues (mobility, migration, inequalities); concepts necessary to understand the complexity of the environment / individuals relationships (space, distance, boundary, limit); tools to understand the relationship between policies and environmental issues.  Autonomy of judgement: To read "critically" the relationship between policies, territory and the environmental issue in late modern society and compare it with what has happened over time.
